



# Cloverdale Minor Baseball

## Travel Subsidy Policies

### Overview

- This policy is to layout the maximum travel subsidy that Cloverdale Minor Baseball may provide to teams required to travel. However, actual amount provided must be approved by the Cloverdale Baseball executive, and will be contingent on funds being available.
- Any funds provided will be provided as a lump sum to the head coach or manager of the team, and it will be their responsibility to distribute the funds at their discretion (or as otherwise laid out in this policy).
- Teams are encouraged to do their own fundraising in order to further subsidize the travel expenses incurred by the team and its families. It will be up to the head coach or manager of the team to distribute these funds at their discretion.

### Spring Teams

- Spring teams are free to travel for tournaments, but any travel costs associated are the responsibility of each team itself, where each family is required to cover their own costs.
- Spring teams who are required to travel to the Sunshine Coast for spring season schedule or playoff games will receive \$250 to subsidize travel costs, to be distributed at the discretion of the head coach or team manager.

### Summer Teams

- Summer teams are free to travel for tournaments, but any travel costs associated are the responsibility of each team itself, where each family is required to cover their own costs.

### Provincials

- Summer teams who qualify for a Provincial Championship Tournament may be funded accordingly:
  - If the tournament is within the lower mainland the team will receive no funding.
  - If the tournament is in the Okanagan or Interior the team will receive \$500.
  - If the tournament is in the North (Prince George) the team will receive \$1000.
  - If the tournament is on Vancouver Island the team will receive \$1000.

### Western and National Qualifiers

- Summer teams who are required to attend a Baseball BC National or Western Qualifier tournament (Pee Wee AAA, Bantam AAA, Midget AAA College Prep) may be funded accordingly:
  - If the tournament is within the lower mainland the team will receive no funding.
  - If the tournament is in the Okanagan or Interior the team will receive \$500.
  - If the tournament is in the North (Prince George) the team will receive \$1000.
  - If the tournament is on Vancouver Island the team will receive \$1000.

### Nationals and Westerns

- For any Cloverdale Baseball team that qualifies to attend a National or Western (Tier I or Tier II) Championship, CMBA may cover the actual per player fee charged by BC Minor Baseball Association (as per Rule 35 of the BC Minor Rule Book) to a maximum of \$400 per player, plus the additional team subsidy:
  - If the tournament is within the lower mainland the team will receive no funding.
  - If the tournament is in the Okanagan or Interior the team will receive \$500.
  - If the tournament is in the North (Prince George) the team will receive \$1000.
  - If the tournament is on Vancouver Island the team will receive \$1000.
  - If the tournament is in the provinces of AB, SK, MB or YT the team will receive \$2000.
  - If the tournament is in the Ontario or further east the team will receive \$3000.



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- A Cloverdale Baseball Midget AAA player, who played for a Cloverdale team during the spring and summer season, who is selected to compete on a BC Minor Team BC for a Midget AAA National Championship, may receive funding up to the amount of the per player fee charged by BC Minor for that event to a maximum of \$500. They will be responsible for any and all of their own expenses above the amount of the BC Minor fee.
- A Cloverdale Baseball player, who played for a Cloverdale team during the spring and summer season, who is "picked up" to play for a team from another association at a Western or National Championship, may receive funding up to the amount of the per player fee charged by BC Minor for that event to a maximum of \$400 per player. They will be responsible for any and all of their own expenses above the amount of the BC Minor fee.
- Cloverdale Baseball DOES NOT cover any player fee or expenses for players picked up to attend a Western or National Championship with any team, unless the team is travelling under the umbrella of BC Minor with the player fees to be paid directly to BC Minor.

### U.S. Tournaments in lieu of Western and Nationals

- For any Cloverdale Baseball team that qualifies to attend a tournament in the U.S.A., where entry in the tournament is determined by being the Provincial Championship winner or runner-up (or by winning a BC Minor qualification tournament), CMBA may cover the actual per player fee charged by BC Minor Baseball Association to a maximum of \$400 per player, plus the additional team subsidy:
  - If the tournament is Washington within 1 hour driving distance of the lower mainland the team will receive no funding.
  - If the tournament is in the states of WA, OR or ID the team will receive \$500.
  - If the tournament is in the states of CA, NV, AZ, NM, UT, MT, WY, ND, SD, NE, CO or KA the team will receive \$1000.
  - If the tournament is in a state not otherwise listed the team will receive \$2000.
- A Cloverdale Baseball player, who played for a Cloverdale team during the spring and summer season, who is "picked up" to play for a team from another association in a U.S. tournament in lieu of a Western or National Championship, may receive funding up to the amount of the per player fee charged by BC Minor for that event to a maximum of \$400. They will be responsible for any and all of their own expenses above the amount of the BC Minor fee.

### Elite Select Teams

- A Cloverdale Baseball player, who played for a Cloverdale team either during the immediate prior season or two of the prior three seasons, who is selected to play for a BC Minor Elite Select to compete a tournament during the season, may receive funding up to the amount of the per player fee charged by BC Minor for that event to a maximum of \$400. They will be responsible for any and all of their own expenses above the amount of the BC Minor fee.
- Cloverdale Baseball DOES NOT cover any player fee or expenses for Elite or Select teams that occur outside of the regular season (i.e. between August 31 and April 1).

### Fall Teams

- Fall Ball teams are responsible for all of their own costs for any travel associated with arranged games or tournaments, where each family is required to cover their own costs.
